

Call for Artists

The Wing Luke Asian Museum invites artists to submit their proposal for a one day artist led art activity, as part of the WLAM's *Family Day at the Wing* series. Each month, on the third Saturday, will have a different artist leading a different activity, which is age appropriate for 5 year olds (with adult supervision) and up and engages the visitor. Adults with no children are also welcomed to participate in these activities.

- We welcome artists of all generations and backgrounds, professional or non-professional, working in all mediums.
- Artists in Washington State have first priority. Artists outside of Washington may be considered.
- Selected artists will receive a \$250 honorarium and an \$85 supply line for new supplies, additional supplies may already be available at the Museum.
- Artists will work with the Community Program Manager to coordinate the purchase of supplies needed for the selected art activity.
- A criminal background check of the Artists will be conducted.
- Photographs of the craft activity may be shown on publicity materials through flyers, e-newsletters, etc.
- **We encourage multi-sensory artwork rooted in Asian customs or traditions OR by contemporary Asian American artists.**

Family Day at the Wing Series Criteria

- Engages families and individuals to create and participate in art;
- Allows artists to interact with the public and exposes the public to their art style and forms;
- Participates are families and friends. Adults with no children are also welcomed to participate in these activities;
- No pre-registration will be taken, these workshops are a drop-in activity;
- The activity must be manageable and can be completed in 30 minutes or less by a 5 year old with or without supervision;
- Occurs monthly on the third Saturday of each month from 1 to 3pm in our Community Hall or another available space;
- In past years, the average attendance for this series was 35 participants. In our new larger venue the anticipated attendance may surpass 80 people.

Artists Compensation: \$250 for one two-hour workshop.
